Resignation of the Clerk - Another
Appointed

At a session of the U.S. District Court yesterday the resignation of Charles G. Rumford Esq. was accepted, and Judge Bradford appointed in his stead S. Rodman Smith, Esq., now Secretary of the Farmers Insurance Company.

Mr. Rumford resigns, we believe, with a view to giving his undivided attention to the practice of his profession, and Mr. Smith accepts with a view to returning to practice at the bar, to which he was admitted some years ago. He will make a courteous and efficient Clerk, and the Court is to be congratulated in securing such a successor for the capable and urbane retiring Clerk.

Shortly after Mr. Smith's appointment as Clerk of the District Court by Judge Bradford he also received an appointment from Judge McKennan as Clerk of the Circuit Court.
