

SELECTION OF ELEANOR G. TENNYSON AS MAGISTRATE JUDGE DISTRICT OF DELAWARE

The United States District Court for the District of Delaware is pleased to announce its selection of Eleanor G. Tennyson as a United States Magistrate Judge. Ms. Tennyson fills the position vacated by Judge Jennifer Hall upon Judge Hall's elevation to the District Court.

Ms. Tennyson is an honors graduate of Grinnell College and received her master's degree in chemistry from the Clemson University Graduate School of Chemistry. Ms. Tennyson earned her law degree from the University of Iowa College of Law where she was managing editor of the *Iowa Law Review*.

Ms. Tennyson has been a career law clerk for the Honorable Maryellen Noreika, United States District Judge, District of Delaware since October 2018. She previously worked as an associate in the intellectual property group at Morris, Nichols, Arsht & Tunnell LLP. Her work there focused on patent litigation, particularly Hatch-Waxman cases and matters involving the chemical arts.

Ms. Tennyson's selection was the culmination of a process that included the screening of numerous applications by a Merit Selection Panel as well as interviews by the Panel and the Court. The Court expresses its gratitude to the members of the Panel for their diligent and important service to the Court.

Ms. Tennyson will assume her duties to the Court, effective July 10, 2024. A formal investiture ceremony will be scheduled at a later date.
