¹ Defendant notes in one of his letters: “At this moment I am at a stand still before the virus.” (D.I. 224) To the extent this is a request for compassionate release due to the ongoing pandemic resulting from COVID-19, it is denied. Defendant cites no authority for such relief; nor is the Court aware of any. *See, e.g.*, 18 U.S.C. § 3582 (providing, for defendants in custody of federal Bureau of Prisons who have exhausted administrative remedies, narrow circumstances – such as “extraordinary and compelling reasons” – in which Court may modify term of imprisonment).
